Drawing upon 50 years of political and spiritual activism, this training offers psycho-spiritual tools to help build your personal empowerment, build coalitions and group energy, and explore methods in conflict transformation and strategic planning to help move forward as a community.

Our times are calling for new models of healing our shared histories of communal trauma and creating a pathway of service to the common good. The intent is to create a safe container for people to support each other while engaging in spiritual activism at this time in the world. We'll take time for dialogue, sharing, learning, and dreaming with the help of the spirits. The goal is to create an ongoing space where people can meet for support and problem solving as they work to bring healing and conflict transformation in their communities and in themselves. Ideally we'll create a circle that will meet occasionally and an online forum for sharing concerns and ideas.

Fee for the day will be \$125. Scholarships will be available based on need as the intent is to be inclusive of all people and fees will be reduced for families/couples/households who wish to participate. All people under the age of 18 who register will be free.

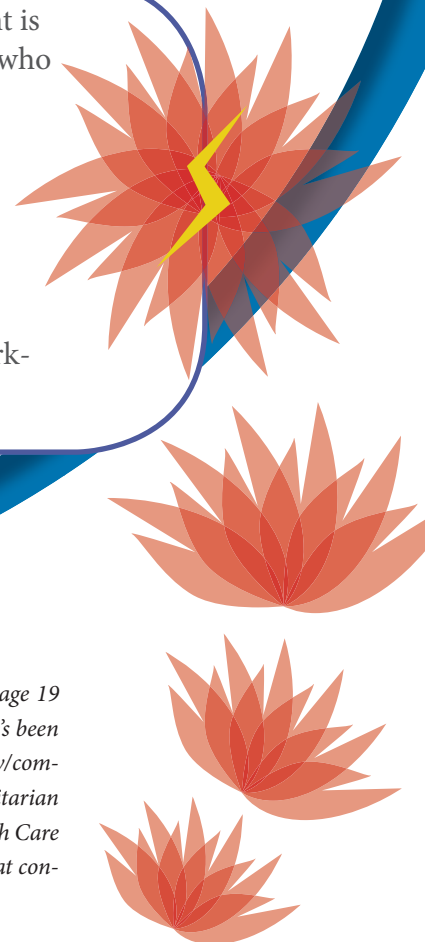

Myron Eshowsky began as an activist with the civil rights movement. He started his first NGO at age 19 to advocate migrant labor organizing and protection of workers against abuse. Through the years, he's been involved in antiwar work, prison rights, consumer rights for patients with mental illness, anti poverty/community organizing, violence prevention and conflict resolution with gangs, union organizing, humanitarian refugee work, and numerous peace/healing projects. He is currently the co-director of the Social Health Care Project for Syrian Refugee Children and Families. For the last 5 years, he has taught internationally at conferences on healing transgenerational / historical trauma in the Jordan, Turkey, and Europe.
